39 FOREIGN NATIONALS INTERDICTED BY THE USCG ARE NOW IN IMMIGRATION CUSTODY

On Friday, April 19, thirty-nine (39) foreign nationals, ten (10) Ecuadorians, one (1) Dominican, and twenty-eight (28) Haitians, were handed over to Immigration officials from the US Coast Guard (USCG) Cutter, Isaac Mayo. The USCG and US Customs and Border Protection reported the first migrant interdiction in Key Largo, Florida, and a second in Biscayne Bay, Florida. On Wednesday, April 24, these migrants were turned over to the Enforcement and Canine Units.

The two groups were cautioned, arrested, and transported to the Carmichael Road Detention Centre for processing. All migrants tested negative for COVID-19. Among the charges they will face in the coming days are **Illegal Landing**, **Illegal Embarkation**, and **Overstaying**.

It is important to remind the public that the Department is committed to effectively coordinating efforts with other law enforcement agencies and international stakeholders to ensure compliance with the Statute Laws of The Bahamas.
